Since then, FFSFBA has planted a tree for each of the international clubs that we have hosted. Today, 18 trees represent those friendships that have been developed and nurtured through all these years. Founders' Day, on Saturday, November 17, at Prusch Park in San Jose, will give all of our members and special guests an opportunity to honor those who inspired and launched this tribute to friendship. At the same time, we can acknowledge the priceless benefit of adding trees to our public places for everyone to enjoy.

Because November is the best month for planting trees, we will be planting on November 17 not only a Founders' Tree for our special honorees but also the trees that we will be dedicating to our visitors from Horowhenua, New Zealand in May 2013 and from Manitoba, Canada in September 2013. #### **JAPANTOWN**

n October 27<sup>th</sup>, a lovely fall day, twenty-five members of FFSFBA visited Japantown, San Jose.

Our visit began with lunch at Minato Sushi. Following lunch the group walked around the block to the San Jose Buddhist Church, a small church surrounded by a lovely garden with unique white granite boulders. These boulders represent the parts of Japanese heritage which have become separated from the mainland of Japan.

We were met at the church by the Reverend Ken Fujimoto. He demonstrated a portion of the chant used in the church's Sunday service and then explained the history and meaning of their sutras. He also interpreted the stunningly beautiful rooms of worship and answered our members' many interesting questions.

After a very enlightening hour with Mr. Fujimoto, we headed for the Japanese American Museum of San Jose, also on 5<sup>th</sup> Street. In front of the museum are notable landmarks of Japantown, such as rustic benches and inverted buckets, which recall the contribution of Japanese Americans to agriculture during the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. Inside the museum, our small group tours were conducted by museum members. Photographs, artifacts and histories brought to life the outrageous internment of Japanese Americans during WWII. One very interesting piece in the museum was a camp barracks building, newly built to the exact government specs that were used in 1942.

All in all... a sobering, informative and lovely day.

#### **DIRECTIONS TO EMMA PRUSCH PARK**

Directions: From the East Bay, take 680 south to the King Road exit. Turn left onto South King Road and right to enter Prusch Park. (Or take 880 to merge with 101 and continue with directions below.)

From the Peninsula, take 280 south, nearly to 680. Exit just past 101, turning right onto S. King Road. Turn right into the park at 647 South King Road, San Jose, CA.

From the West Bay, take 101 south to Santa Clara Street exit toward San Jose State/CA-130/Alum Rock Avenue. Turn left onto E. Santa Clara Street. East Santa Clara becomes Alum Rock Avenue. Turn right onto S. King Road. Turn right into the park at 647 South King Road, San Jose, CA.

#### **DIRECTIONS TO MICHAELS RESTAURANT**

Take Highway 101 to Mountain View. Exit on North Shoreline, and go approximately 2 miles to the restaurant. Free parking is available in the restaurant's parking lot (near the golf course).
